



#### Where did the name "The Rainbow Project" come from?

The Rainbow has always been used as a symbol of hope. It is a promise that something better is sure to follow. In the midst of a rain storm, the sun appears and creates a rainbow. And every child knows the legend of the pot of gold at the end of the rainbow. We decided to use it because it was a simple, positive and friendly name that young children could easily say and remember.

#### The Rainbow Project

Established in 1980 by Sharyl Kato, Executive Director, *The Rainbow Project* is a local non-profit counseling clinic that provides crisis treatment and early intervention services for young children and their families who have experienced or witnessed trauma,



including child sexual abuse, neglect and/or domestic violence. The clinic has provided services for over 10,700 children and over 10,200 caregivers. The Rainbow Project is well known not only locally, but also nationally for pioneering techniques in prevention, trauma recovery and developing programs which have been shown to break the cycles of family and community violence.

The Project's unique "hands on" approach is unlike that of any other therapy clinic because it includes home, day care and school visits. In fact, this is one of the reasons why working at Rainbow is part of the curriculum for all University of Wisconsin, Department of Psychiatry, Child Abuse and Adolescent Residents who elect to specialize in child psychiatry. The Rainbow Project works closely with all levels of law enforcement and the courts not only to protect the rights of abused children, but also to bring the offenders to justice. Many of Rainbow's clients are referrals from the legal system who are the victims of severe tragedies in our community.



#### **Services of the Rainbow Project**

### Rainbow Project services are intended to...

- Promote positive change within families, including building, strengthening, and supporting healthy parent/child relationships (improving child behaviors and development, and providing parent education and support).
- Prevention, early intervention, and treatment for families affected by family violence (including services to families with patterns that place members at risk for maltreatment or future mental health concerns).
- Advocate for the mental health needs and support of families and children in the community
- Strengthen the capacity of the larger community to prevent, respond to, and support those who have experienced trauma (including community violence, grief/loss, natural disasters, child maltreatment, domestic violence, substance
- Abuse, mental illness, and adjustment to other life transitions.

### Services offered may include one or more of the following:

- Comprehensive diagnostic assessment and developmental evaluation, with emphasis on socialemotional development and behavior, for young children and adults.
- Assessment of parent-child interaction and family relationships
- Referral services to other specialized community services for family members
- Child play therapy
- Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT)
- Adult treatment and counseling with individuals, couples, family, or groups

- Parent education in individual, parent-child play sessions, or group settings
- In-home treatment
- Interagency coordination, case management, and advocacy
- Consultation services with teachers, foster parents, nurses, and others involved with the family
- Individualized service planning
- Evaluation and follow-up services

### Speakers Bureau & Consultation Services

In addition to their direct clinical work with children and families, the Rainbow Project therapists also provide training presentations, consultation services and technical assistance on a local, state, national and international level.

Topics requested and provided include a broad range of issues focusing on recognizing, preventing and responding to the needs of children, parent's/ caregivers and families who have experienced trauma, including child abuse, neglect, domestic violence, child sexual abuse, community violence, grief/loss, natural disasters, serious physical/mental illness, incarceration of a family member, substance abuse and social/ emotional development. Intended audiences include school staff, early childhood educations, childcare providers, social workers, advocates, law enforcement, those representing the court system, medical field, other mental health and human service providers, foster parents, after school and community center staff, volunteers, caregiver groups and shelter staff.

Each presentation is tailored to a specific audience and includes conference presentations, in-services and workshops, from 1-2 hours to a half or all day training that includes hands-on activities, as well as power point, role play and other materials, resources, references and learning demonstrations.
